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1 MR. O'REILLY: Okay. Your Honor, might this be

3 and be sure to talk to the court beforehand.

11 MR. COOLEY: We go down at 1:30, your Honor?

12 THE COURT: 1:30, fine.

13 MR. COOLEY: Mr. O'Reilly has indicated he wants  
14 to get the court's advice on something. I think it might  
15 be appropriate to stay and get it.

16 THE COURT: Yes. Yes.

17 There are no jurors present.

18 What did you want to make an inquiry about?

19 MR. O'REILLY: Well, your Honor, probably some  
20 time within the next 30 minutes or so the examination  
21 I am going to get into, him leaving Scientology organization  
22 in Los Angeles -- I mean, in Minneapolis and coming out  
23 here to Los Angeles for what was called the Power process  
24 of auditing.

25 And I am going to be asking him questions  
26 about basically what happened to him on that particular  
27 process.

28 So what I wanted to do was clear with the

1 court beforehand that, like, your Honor, now I am going  
2 to go into this particular area and I want to be sure  
3 that I haven't misunderstood the court's ruling, or whatever,  
4 when I do so.

5 He will not be testifying about anything  
6 that's contained in those documents that were sealed  
7 and stamped confidential when they were identified on  
8 the record, the upper level materials. He will not be  
9 testifying from those or about the contents of those  
10 in any respect.

11 MR. COOLEY: Well, then I understand that although  
12 we have objected to even that, that it complies with  
13 the court's ground rule that there be no testimony  
14 from those documents or about their contents --

15 THE COURT: In the so-called upper levels materials.

16 MR. COOLEY: Yes, sir. The upper levels materials  
17 being defined as power through NOTS.
